



1. The minutes of the XXII, Assembly distributed on March 21, 1969 were taken as read and approved.
2. The application of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary to join Sedos was unanimously accepted.
3. Fr H. Mondé, in the chair, reported on progress:
  - a - Spiritus would publish the acts of the Mission Theology Symposium in a special number scheduled for September 1969. Brother Thomas More

had offered \$ 500 to hire a professional writer to present the ideas of the Symposium to missionaries. Fr Arrupe, as President of the USG, had suggested a study session of the USG on the subject of mission. The acts of the Symposium could be discussed during this session.

It was agreed to form a small committee of theologians from the Sedos Institutes to evaluate the Symposium, (especially find out which specific questions were not answered) to select and guide the professional writer and to take charge of liaison with the USG, and eventual study sessions on mission theology.

- b - The Congo Kinshasa Episcopal Conference had promised to forward to Sedos detailed proposals in implementing the Sedos Misereor schema in its country. Br Vincent had met the Major Superiors of Eastern Africa and would report to the next Assembly. The Seminar on Indonesia had been held but no report had as yet reached Sedos.
- c - Sister Gates explained the origin and purpose of the project for a Seminar on Comprehensive Health Care in November 1969 (see Sedos Doc. 69/539). The Assembly agreed to sponsor the Seminar, with the Confederation of Catholic Hospitals, because many missionaries would profit from the coordination which the Seminar would set out to promote. It was also agreed that Sedos could not assume any financial responsibilities for the Seminar.
- d - Fr Maertens cism highlighted the project for a Seminar on Credit Unions in the Mission in March 1970. The purpose would be an action programme to extend and to develop the credit union movement in the Mission. The Seminar would consist of a meeting of resource persons who could with the Superiors General, draw conclusions on how to achieve this extension and development work. The Assembly agreed to sponsor the Seminar - again without assuming any financial responsibilities. It entrusted the Working Group for Development to hammer out the details.
- e - Fr Fecher svd presented the idea behind his proposal for research on Catechists: to provide the members of the Council of the 24 of the Propaganda Fide with factual material on the items on their agenda. It was agreed to appoint a small group to take the project in hand and to draw up a report before the end of 1969. Fr Mondé also asked the Assembly for comments (before the end of June) on a questionnaire on Catechists which he was sending to the dioceses entrusted to the SMA. He also invited the Superiors General to use it as an instrument for collecting data on Catechists, by distributing it among their dioceses, and their Catechetical training centres and among other sources of information about catechists. He was positive that Propaganda Fide would appreciate the initiative.

f - Fr H. Mondé presented a statement prepared by the Working Group for Social Communications. The message was that social communications had become an essential aspect of evangelization but that not all responsible for missionary policy were aware of the facts. It was agreed to ask the Working Group to prepare for the next Assembly a project for a Seminar in November 1970. The purpose of the Seminar would not be to organize mass media for the whole mission field but create more awareness, among the members of Sedos, of the opportunities for evangelization which would be missed if they did not coordinate their activities in this sector.

4. The Assembly then broke into three groups to discuss the Working paper on the Second Sedos Plan. The following are the reports of each group, presented to the members after supper.

a - French Speaking group, Chairman: Fr J. Maertens cism  
Secretary: Fr B. Tonna

- .1 The weekly Bulletin should be continued but it should not become too long. The Secretariat should sum up certain documents, rather than printing them in full. In particular, the Bulletin should have a new section, in which readers are informed about the nature of documents available at the Secretariat or at the member Generalates.
- .2 The Executive Committee could promote continuous contact with the Working Groups by inviting their chairmen to attend its meetings, whenever it intend to discuss points studied by the same groups.
- .3 The fourth level of Sedos activity - planning for cooperation in the field - was understood by the Group as "making possible" rather than actually "taking in hand" such cooperation. It was agreed that Sedos should aim at practical, concrete achievements in the field of cooperation and that it should not be content with simply distributing information. Operating at the Generalate level, it could ensure that the missionaries in the field come together and cooperate as opportunity offers.
- .4 The "meetings by country" should be continued. But they should adopt the "group dynamics" techniques, so that they achieve good discussion and not merely "parlor talk". In this respect, one could invite visiting Generals and Assistants, on their return, to share their impressions with members of other Generalates interested in the areas covered. Cross-cultural exchanges could be introduced in order to refresh the views of Assistants who might tend to become too familiar with just one region but not too aware of resolutions adopted elsewhere.

b - English speaking Group (1) Chairman: Fr Th. Walsh mm  
Secretary: Fr M. Reuver O Carm

- .1 The weekly Bulletin could usefully include summaries of the conclusions and recommendations of Seminars on the topics of the various Sedos Working Groups.

- .2 Rather than aiming at comprehensive studies of all that missionaries are doing, Sedos should try to focus, as opportunity offers, on limited sectors of missionary activity.
- .3 The series of meetings by country should be started again. One of their objectives could be the building of a network of Sedos correspondents from the field.
- .4 Sedos cannot attempt to plan for the mission field. But its services to this field should not be limited to the distribution of information. It should attempt to inspire practical cooperation among the missionaries of various Institutes.
- .5 The group agreed on the following priorities:
  - 1st The development of the exchange of facts and ideas, through meetings on specific countries and, within these, through the discussion of specific areas of missionary activity.
  - 2nd The organization, by the different working groups, of study weeks on specific issues, within the broad topic assigned to them by the Assembly.
  - 3rd The collection and circulation of information as a first step towards cooperation in the field.

c - English speaking group (II) Chairman: Fr F. Sackett omi  
Secretary: Sr A. Schellekens sa

- .1 The group thanked the Sedos Secretariat for the sterling work accomplished under the first Sedos Plan. With <sup>out</sup> such work, Sedos would not have achieved so much.
- .2 All the four levels of Sedos activity outlined in the Working paper should be pursued. The weekly bulletin has been the best achievement. Consultation should be tailored down to the means at the disposal of Sedos, because of the huge amount of correspondence it could eventually involve. The meetings by country should be functional: they should be scheduled only when Superiors General sense a common, specific problem in the country in question. The Seminars should be kept to one a year, given the tremendous burden they impose on the Secretariat. Finally, Sedos should carefully study how to plan cooperation in the field, at the level of the Generalates. One way would be to show that, as the administrative tasks are delegated to the local Superiors, the Generalates could devote more time to sheer planning.
- .3 In general, Sedos had been very productive during the first Sedos plan and the group did not think it could have done more. In order to ensure more relevancy to its efforts, it should try to specify its objectives still further, providing the Secretariat with very clear instructions.

- .4 The group was not very clear on the exact meaning of the Data System proposed in the Working Paper. It thought this system could be very useful if it exposed areas of "over and under lapping" in missionary activities. Another proposal was to introduce a "want ad" section in the bulletin, with each Generalate asking for possible helps from other Generalates.
  - .5 First priority should be given to plan concrete coordination. Within this, the first task is to find out how it could be done.
5. The next Assembly of Superiors General was convened for September 30, 1969.

#### CREDIT UNION SEMINAR

It was reported that the General Assembly had agreed to Sedos assuming the organizational responsibility for the Credit Union Seminar proposed by J. van den Dries for 1970.

The Working Group studied the program proposed by van den Dries (Ref. Sedos 69/514 & 515) and modified the timing somewhat - final result is attached.

Father van den Dries will meet with the Working Group for Development about 20 June (the members will be informed of the exact time by phone) and will consider the following working papers:

- 1 - Program of Seminar
- 2 - Responsibility outline
- 3 - Participation
- 4 - Timing of Action
- 5 - Budget for the secretariat, room and board, etc.  
(estimate based on 20 participants - to be increased proportionately if participation increases)

all of which are attached.

Fr van den Dries will be asked to have the background papers of the seminar available in time to reach the participants one month in advance of the seminar. These would include:

- 1 - General background information on credit unions for those not already engaged in Credit Unions activity
- 2 - Comprehensive surveys of all Credit Unions activities in the three areas to be covered by the seminar

It will also be clarified as to what possible type of report or publication is expected to result from the seminar. The Working Group for Development suggests that the following suffice:

- 1 - Explanation of the seminar, participants, etc.
- 2 - The major speeches
- 3 - The surveys of the areas of Credit Unions activity as mentioned above
- 4 - The conclusions

Who assumes responsibility for the publication and distribution of such a report? It is not included in the proposed budget.

The Working Group for Development then reviewed the Status of Other Activities of this group.

- 1 - Misereor-Sedos Scholarship Program - work continues on informing the Bishops' conferences and we are awaiting their reactions. When the scholarship applications start coming in, a selecting committee will be informed. Misereor will now be sent a letter to bring them up to date on this project.
- 2 - Local Development Seminars - letters have been mailed to the Bishops' conferences and personal contact is being made by Sedos members currently traveling in the developing countries to stimulate these seminars and offer help in programming them when possible.
- 3 - Inventory Cards on Training Facilities & on "Experts" - have already been made and are being kept current and available for reference by any members.
- 4 - Catalogue of Funding Agencies - is being kept current and available for reference.

No particular action of the Working Group for Development is required at present for any of the above, and so the next meeting on 20 June to finalize plans for the Credit Unions Seminar will be the last meeting of this Working Group until after the summer.
